

Brauman was born in 1950 in Israël. He is a doctor and, since 1988, a professor at the Université de Paris XII. From 1978 to 1982, he was the coordinating doctor with Médecins Sans Frontières [Doctors Without Borders], and undertook many missions with them largely in conflict zones and refugee camps. While with MSF, he established programs for medical assistance and surgery in Asia, Africa, and Central America. From 1982 to 1994, he was President of Médecins Sans Frontières. Rony Brauman is also the co-founder and director (1984 to 1988) of Liberté sans Frontières [Freedom Without Borders]. In 1999, he directed, with Eyal Sivan "Un spécialiste" [The Specialist], a film on the Adolf Eichmann trial that is composed of archive footage from within the courtroom. He has published many essays and texts on humanitarianism.
